

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

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

Colin Campbell is a dentist originally from the West coast of Scotland. He graduated from the University of Glasgow with a degree in Dentistry in 1994 and in 1997 became a fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh by examination.

Colin entered practice in 1997 as a Vocational Dental Practitioner and began to build up a referral service in Oral surgery and Implant dentistry.

In 1999 Colin became a General Dental Council registered Specialist in Oral surgery, following time as a House Officer and Senior House Officer in Oral surgery in Glasgow, Nottingham and Derby.

In 2005 Colin was elected to fellowship of the International Team of Implantology which is now a network of 16,000 practitioners worldwide with 1,000 fellows. In the UK, there are 1,000 members and approximately 60 fellows. The ITI promotes implant dentistry through research, education and development. Colin has sat on a leadership team as the UK and Ireland ITI Communications Officer and been involved in the organisation of major conferences and many courses on behalf of the ITI.

Currently Colin's main job is the owner and Clinical Director of The Campbell Clinic in Nottingham, which is a multidisciplinary specialist practice, providing treatment in many aspects of dentistry, but overwhelmingly implant dentistry. Colin has placed over 5,000 dental implants and restored thousands of dental implants previously. His work is now limited to implant and oral surgery.

Colin is also the founder and Clinical Director of The Campbell Academy, which is an implant education organisation based in The Campbell Clinic facility in Nottingham. In 2020 The Campbell Clinic moved to a purpose-built facility in Nottingham providing an exceptional clinical and teaching environment.

Colin has lectured in implant dentistry and oral surgery nationally and internationally now for over 20 years, and provided thousands and thousands of hours of education. He has provided expert witnesses in medical legal cases of a criminal, civil and regulatory nature, and is called upon to give expert advice in many areas of oral and implant surgery frequently.



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Dr Andrew Legg graduated from the University of Manchester in 2001. He joined a large dental practice in South Manchester the same year becoming an associate in 2002. He then became a partner in August 2003 following the departure of two esteemed colleagues. This extensive experience in general practice has given Andrew grounding in all aspects of dental care allowing a fully comprehensive approach to patient care.

In 2004 Andrew began his postgraduate training in Oral Surgery and Implant Dentistry and has since undertaken over 500 hours of training including Advanced Surgical Training at the Royal College of Surgeons.

Andrew has experience with several of the major implant systems and is experienced in all aspects of surgery including bone and sinus grafting. He has a particular interest in immediate full arch implant dentistry and has completed several hundred cases using a variety of techniques. Recently, in his role at The Campbell Academy, Andrew has developed the first Straumann Pro Arch course in the UK and is working closely with Straumann to develop this provision across the country.

Andrew is passionate about the use of dental implants in helping restore patients to a more natural form and function and believes they play a pivotal role in improving the quality of life and general health in patients.

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
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Beatriz began her studies in Barcelona University (Spain) and soon started developing a special interest in oral surgery. She completed a postgraduate course in the field, focused in the removal of impacted wisdom teeth. After moving to England in 2010, she enrolled in her first formal postgraduate implant course, in the UCL Eastman Dental Institute (PG Dip), London. Once finished, she wanted to continue studying and gaining experience leading to her joining the University of Central Lancashire MSc which she completed in 2017.

At the moment, she has over 6 years of clinical experience in the dental implants field, and she dedicates 2 days a week exclusively to dental implants, placing around 80 implants a year. She feels confident in different scenarios and provides a level of straightforward, advanced and complex implant surgery including extensive grafting cases, multiple implant placement and all aspects of minor oral surgery. She is experienced in digital workflow, as well as the use of CBCT as gold standard to case planning.

Beatriz has been involved in different formative programs as a student meaning she is well aware of the learners necessities and can talk from a very close perspective to the students' views. She has also been involved in teaching and lecturing at different levels both in practical and theoretical fields, from being an assistant teacher at University of Barcelona, to being awarded the best oral presentation in the National Prosthodontics Spanish Congress. She has been part of The Campbell Academy faculty since 2016 and gets involved in different activities organised.



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Colin Burns is an Implant Dentist from Glasgow, based at the award winning Scottish Centre for Excellence in Dentistry, a Practice that looks after over 900 referring Dentists.

Colin is Chairman of the UK and Ireland Section of the International Team for Implantology (ITI), an ITI mentor, and an ITI speaker.

Colin places and restores dental implants, and provides bone grafting, sinus grafting and all aspects of implant dentistry. His particular area of interest is implant surface technology, bone biology and bone regeneration, in which he achieved his MSc in Implant Dentistry (with Merit) from the University of Warwick.

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Michael qualified in 1998 before achieving his PhD in 2001 from the University of Basel. He continued his training in Oral Surgery and Stomatology in Basel before becoming a board-certified Oral Surgeon in June 2003.

Michael was previously the Clinical Professor in Oral and Maxillofacial Radiology in the Faculty of Dentistry at The University of Hong Kong. However, he has recently returned to Basel as the Clinical Director and Professor at the University Centre for Dental Medicine.

Since 2019 he's also serving as Associate Dean of 'Research & Innovation' at the faculty.

Michael is a board-certified Oral Surgeon with extensive experience in dental radiology, Cone Beam CT and Oral Surgery including GBR and bio-resorbable membranes.

He was instrumental in the production of the CBCT guidelines for the AO, EAO and has been involved as a group leader in recent ITI Consensus Meeting where he reported on the CBCT guidance.

Michael is an experienced pioneer in the use of CBCT in implant dentistry and his experience is second to none.



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Karen qualified from Edinburgh in 1994 and moved to Nottingham. Having worked in both NHS and Corporate practices over the years, she now works full time in Specialist Practice – The Campbell Clinic.

Her role is to provide NSPT for referred Perio patients, and both Pre-op and Maintenance for Implant patients. Ten years ago Karen developed Protocols based on Oral Hygiene and Risk for all patients undergoing implant treatments. This has resulted in a successful Hygienist led Maintenance programme for all implant patients within the practice. Following on from this Karen has had a paper published on the 'Importance of good oral hygiene to help support and maintain implants'.

Chris has co-authored Profitable Dental Practice (with Prof. Phil Newsome) and The E-Myth Dentist (with Michael Gerber) and is a prolific contributor to dental journals as well as author of his own e-books and blog since 2004. In 2014 Chris experienced a "brief but enjoyable" summer of celebrity after appearing as one of the first castaways on the TV survival show "The Island with Bear Grylls", abandoned with 12 others on a Pacific desert island and left to fend for themselves for a month.

Chris continues to coach dental businesses under the Extreme Business brand, delivering 1:1 consultancy for owners and workshops in the UK, Ireland, South Africa and Australia and through a unique global online learning portal, The Extreme Business Club.



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

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

He is also the ethics columnist for the British Dental Journal and co-host of the 'Incisive Decisive' dental ethics podcast with Colin Campbell.





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
